Introduction

Most households rely on gas appliances such as boilers, cookers and fires. When gas appliances are badly fitted or poorly maintained they can be dangerous, causing gas leaks, fires, explosions or carbon monoxide poisoning.

Follow the safety tips below to keep your family gas safe.

How can I stay gas safe?

- Always use Gas Safe registered engineers to fit, fix or service gas appliances.
- Get your gas appliances checked once a year.
 If you are renting, your landlord has a legal responsibility to do this.
- Fit a carbon monoxide alarm.

What is carbon monoxide?

Carbon monoxide is a poisonous gas produced by unsafe gas appliances. You can't see it or smell it but it can cause death and serious injuries.

Oil and solid fuels such as coal, wood, petrol and oil can also produce carbon monoxide.
